What Students Need to Know About Apprenticeships, by Jonathan Hughes

originally published by meta It's not surprising that amid the anxiety over the rising cost of college, many students and families would look for alternatives. Case in point, apprenticeships. According to the U.S. Department of Labor, the United States has seen a 64% increase in apprenticeships over the past decade. For those like me whose only real previous points of reference to apprenticeships were a reality TV show and the life story of Benjamin Franklin, it's way past time to talk about them.

THE BASICS

An apprenticeship is a paid educational program. It is a way for workers to earn money while learning a new skill or trade. This may be for new employees or for veterans looking to "upskill" and increase their earning power in their current job or field. Like a degree, those who complete an apprenticeship will receive a certification continued on page 2

The Coast Guard Exchange Scholarship Program This program was established to provide additional financial resources to dependent children of Coast Guard personnel embarking on undergraduate college/university studies. Annually, \$2,000 scholarships are awarded to outstanding applicants on a one-time basis. This year, there are expected to be 20 recipients. For details, visit <u>studentscholarships.org</u> /scholarship/20641/coast-guard-exchange-scholarship-program. The deadline is February 28, 2024.

Fundacao Faialense, Inc. Scholarship Program This award is open to graduating seniors who plan on attending a college, vocational or technical institution of higher learning. Selection is based on academic record, personal qualifications, financial need and other credentials submitted by or on behalf of each applicant. Please visit <u>tinyurl.com/FundacaoSchol</u> to download the application. Applications are due by February 28, 2024.

Jack Terry Memorial Scholarship This scholarship aims to honor the life of Dr. Jack Terry by supporting students who have overcome hardships or adversity in their lives. Jack Terry was born in Poland in 1930, lost his entire family in the Holocaust and struggled to survive three Nazi Concentration Camps. At the end of the war, an American Army officer found Jack alone in the camp and arranged for him to come to the United States. Jack was then 15 years old, had no more than an elementary school education, and did not speak English. Yet, he worked hard through high school and college, became a geological engineer, and later went to medical school and became a psychoanalyst. Later in life, Jack devoted much of his time to sharing his story with students, spreading knowledge and hope. Any high school senior who has at least a 3.0 GPA and limited resources to afford the cost of higher education may apply for this scholarship. Merrimack Valley & Bridgewater Credit Unions Scholarship Program Graduating seniors in the Merrimack Valley and South Shore regions are eligible and do not need membership with the credit unions to apply. Applicants must electronically submit a copy of their transcript, one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor, coach, etc., and complete the essay with no more than 500 words. Visit www.mvcu.com/scholarship for the application and essay prompt. Multiple awards available: Lisa Lewis Goodman Community Spirit Award (\$2,500), fourteen \$1,000 awards. Apply by February 29, 2024. Information Security Undergraduate Scholarship Up to 20 scholarships ranging from \$1000-\$5000 will be awarded to students pursuing or planning to pursue a degree with a focus on cybersecurity, information assurance, or similar field in the fall of 2024. TheDream.US Scholarship TheDream.US scholarships cover the full cost of tuition and fees for highly motivated undocumented students

who are eligible to receive in-state tuition in their home state (not applicable if attending a private institution) but still have significant, unmet financial need. They have no access to federal aid and limited access to state aid. Salem State University and University of Massachusetts Boston are partner schools. Incoming or current students who are DACA or Undocumented can apply for the National scholarship. Visit <u>thedream.us</u> for details! The deadline for the application is February 29, 2024.

Donald and Barbara Mozley Scholarship This award provides support for students pursuing an engineering degree at an ABET-accredited college or university. Applicants should be active in a STEM activity in or out of school, or a STEM mentor/volunteer. Multiple awards of \$5000 each year will be awarded. The deadline to apply is February 29. 2024. **Tau Beta Pi Engineering Scholarship** Tau Beta Pi Association, the

engineering honor society, is the world's largest engineering society. The purpose of the Tau Beta Pi is to recognize engineering students of superior scholarship and exemplary character and to foster a spirit of liberal culture in engineering colleges. Headquartered in Knoxville, TN, the Association's largest national philanthropy is its fellowship program, which has provided \$7,809,000 in advanced-study grants to 1,706 students, and the scholarship program that has provided \$6,557,000 in awards to 3,369 engineering seniors. Applicants must be US residents with a minimum unweighted GPA of 3.75, planning to pursue an engineering or related science degree through an ABET accredited program. For details and to apply, visit

Women's Cyber Security Scholarships This scholarship, designed just for women, offers between \$1000 and \$5,000 to a woman who is pursuing, or plans to pursue, a degree with a focus on cybersecurity or information assurance, and who has a GPA of at least 3.3 on a 4.0 scale. American Chemical Society Scholars Program The ACS Scholars Program awards renewable scholarships to undergraduate students from historically underrepresented groups in the chemical sciences, majoring in chemistry-related disciplines, and intending to pursue chemistry-related careers. Selected recipients are awarded up to \$5,000* per academic year. Applications can be found by going to <u>www.acs.org/education/acs-scholars.html</u>. Completed applications are due by March 1, 2024.

Columbus Citizens Foundation To be eligible, applicants must be of Italian descent (at least 25%) and have a minimum GPA of 3.5. The deadline is March 1, 2024. **Massachusetts Elks Vocational Scholarship** The MA Elks Vocational Scholarship is for students who are going to school full time in a nonbachelor's degree/vocational program. Marine Corps Scholarship Foundation To be eligible for the scholarship a student must be a child or stepchild of an Active duty, Reserve, or veteran U.S. Marine, and have a minimum GPA of 2.0. Applicants must demonstrate financial need through a family adjusted gross income of \$117,000, and be planning to attend an accredited school that is eligible for federal funding. The application is found at www.mcsf.org/apply/eligibility/ and is due by March 1, 2024. National Italian American Foundation Scholarship This organization will award \$12,000 to 200 qualified applicants. Applicants must have an active NIAF Membership, or be the child or grandchild of an active member. To be eligible for the scholarship a student must be enrolled in a US accredited institution of higher education on a full-time basis for the Fall 2024 semester and have a GPA of at least 3.5 out of 4.0 (or the equivalent). Applications can be found by going to www.niaf.org/programs/scholarships. They are due by March 1, 2024. Military Benefit Association Scholarship The Military Benefit Association has established a scholarship program to assist members' dependent children and spouses, along with National Guardsmen, Reservists and Veterans who are members and who plan to continue education in college or vocational school programs. Scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at any accredited institution of the student's choice. This year, MBA will award up to 25, \$3,000 college scholarships for the Academic Year 2024. Eligible applicants include high school seniors who are enrolling full-time as an undergraduate student at an accredited two or four year college, university or vocational-technical school in the Fall of 2024, have a 2.5 grade point average, and are the unmarried, dependent child under age 26 of an MBA member. Microsoft Disability Scholarship To be eligible for the scholarship, a student must be a current high school senior living with a disability (as defined by WHO), whether that be visual, hearing, mobility,

cognitive, speech or other disability. The applicant must plan to enroll in an undergraduate program at an accredited 2 or 4-year University/College or Vocational/Technical School, in the United in the following eligible majors: engineering, computer science, computer information systems, law, business, or a related field (e.g. paralegal, pre-law, finance, business administration, or marketing). Applicants should demonstrate a passion for technology and demonstrate leadership at school and/or in the community. Recipient will receive a \$5,000 award. Up to 10 awards will be granted. Awards are renewable up to three years or until a bachelor's degree is earned, whichever occurs first, on the basis of satisfactory academic performance maintaining a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale, full-time or half-time enrollment, and continued enrollment in the eligible major. Blacks at Microsoft Scholarship BAM is dedicated to supporting the continued growth and development of black employees and encouraging students to pursue a career in technology. The BAM Scholarship was created to enable Black and African American students to attend college and pursue a career in technology. The goal is to empower future generations to do and be more. Applicants must be a US-based high school senior of African descent (for example, African American, African, Ethiopian, etc.), planning to attend a fouryear college or university in the US in the fall immediately following your high school graduation, pursuing a bachelor's degree in engineering, computer science, computer information systems, or select business programs (such as finance, business administration, or marketing), with financial need.
